Supplying genuine banknotes is YOUR responsibility













Do you have an ATM that you fill with banknotes?

If you do, you should only fill it with genuine banknotes.

- Counterfeit banknotes are rare, but they are worthless so it pays
 to be careful. It is always important to check the authenticity of
 banknotes. You may already use manual checks (as described at
 www.bankofengland.co.uk/banknotes/pages/retailers) but if a note
 is dispensed from a machine to a customer, the Code of Conduct
 requires it to be checked first with a note checking machine.
- Following the Code of Conduct means your customers are protected and will receive genuine notes from your ATM or other machine which dispenses cash. Note checkers don't have to be costly and if you use one at the till point you also protect yourself from accepting counterfeits.
